As you know, the 311 HIVE was founded in August '93 to provide fans with 311 tour dates and happenings. We were authorized by the band to sell 311 merchandise to support that effort. Over the past six months, our mailing list has been growing by close to 2,000 names per month and is still growing. Therefore, we have asked 311's management to phase in a mail-order merchandise operation, and they have agreed.

MICHAEL in OH:


